

HIVE

- In 2019 the school decided to set up a provision called the HIVE.
- Manor Green School firmly believes that students who are unable to attend school because of medical, physical or other health reasons have the statutory right to an education and must receive a suitable and flexible education, including a broad and balanced curriculum, within their home.
- As a result of this demand, HIVE -Home Integrated
 Varied Education provision, was founded to support and
 meet the educational needs of students who are critically ill
 or in need of continuous medical care.














Opportunities

- Career interview


Opportunities

Apprenticeship provider

- Successfully applied to become an apprenticeship provider
- We are an apprenticeship provider at a 3 stage model of development
- 1. Apprenticeships within MGS staff, support with recruitment and retention
- 2. Delivery of apprenticeship within other schools
- 3. Student apprenticeships in conjunction with the newly established Careers hub

Apprenticeship

- Over 70 members of our staff have completed an apprenticeship since August 2018 many with distinction
- Where the member of staff is learning new skills:
- Stepping up to HLTA level
- Organising afterschool support
- Working in a different key stage
- Supporting a different subject
- Supporting a student with SEN



APPRENTICESHOP

- Homeware charity shop run by 3 SEND schools in the center of Maidenhead town
- Allows our students to manage the store 2days a week



THEINK

LINK

- Established in 2016
- Primary LINK: reception to Y6; for students who had been permanently excluded or in risk of it
- Secondary Link: Y7 to 11; for vulnerable students who have been unable to engage in mainstream education
- Both units are therapeutic provisions with 3 full time counsellors who work with the YP and very importantly with the families



COLLEGE-LINK

College link/careers hub

- Opened this September
- Site is set up as a job and support Centre
- Rationale: to support YP (16-25) with an EHCP into apprenticeship, internships or employment
- The curriculum design to supplement college courses, providing careers advice, work experience opportunities, travel training, banking and awareness of personal finances
